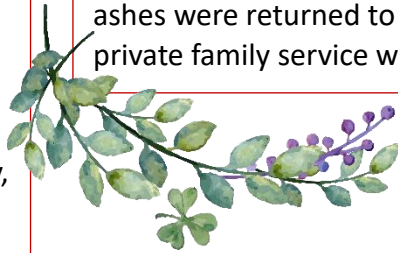

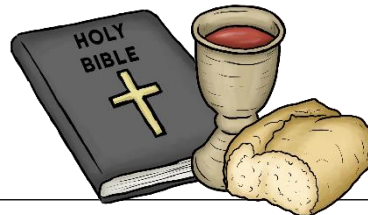
## Rest in Peace

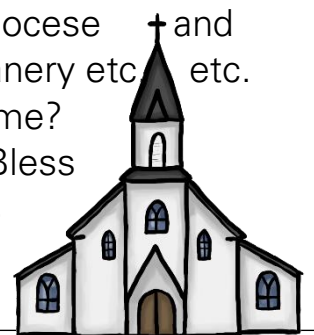
## Knights of Columbus

Congratulations to this year's organizers, Nadia Rodriguez, Jessica Howard, and Bella Matney.



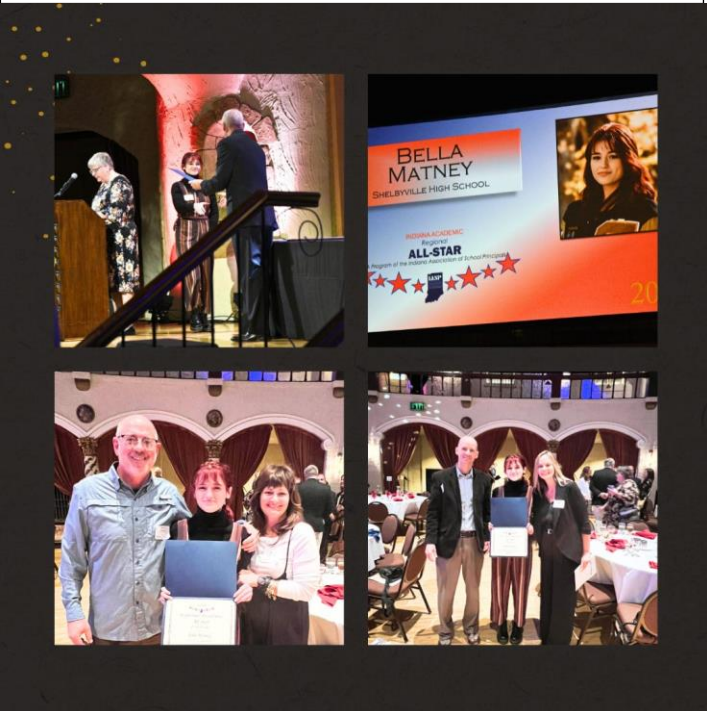
**REGIONAL ACADEMIC ALL-STAR:**

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE:  
The Parish Council met on  
Tuesday, May 21, 2024



**FINANCE:** Margaret Haehl reported that the Sunday collections for the month-to-date are up 11.47% and for the year-to-date are up 3.11%. Total income month-to-date is up 31.77% and for the year-to-date is up 11.54%. Expenses are under budget by 33.04% which gives a positive balance of \$163,392.14.

**BUILDING AND GROUNDS:** David Adams reported that the hall parking lot was re-coated and striped and 2 additional handicapped spaces were marked. The garage overhang was repaired, and new gutters will be installed. There was some water in the church basement, and it was determined that the backup battery for the sump pump needed replaced. He and Greg Esslinger will put mulch behind the schoolhouse where the old sidewalk was removed. A covering under the new ramp is needed to keep the children from going under the ramp. Brian Haehl noted the need to paint the step between the garage and hall to make it more visible since someone recently tripped. This should help until the Knights of Columbus can remove the step and create a ramp for easier accessibility. Mary Giesting mentioned the need to have a daily inspection of the grounds and a contact person when problems arise. A committee was suggested, and several names were mentioned. Margaret Haehl will contact and meet with the committee and present names and duties at the June meeting.

**FAITH FORMATION/RELIGIOUS ED/YOUTH:** Mary Giesting noted that this will be her last meeting as Cathy Lampton will be heading up the program which will be titled Shelby Catholic Religious Education. Mary noted that the May Crowning and end of year gathering was well attended. Several students expressed concerns about merging the programs and it was suggested a review of the results in the future. Mary hopes to keep the school library available. Cathy Lampton reported that the youth group helped to clean up after the St. Joe Festival. She is working with the catechists to organize the classes for next year. Registration is ongoing. Preparations for VBS are going well and several summer events are being planned.

**EVANGELIZATION:** Joan Knight reported that the combined meeting with St. Joseph is coming up and a plan for the remainder of the year will be discussed. She suggested that we have a prayer card or prayer placed in the bulletin for the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Father's Day gifts will be provided.

**ST. ANN ALTAR SOCIETY:** Amy Higdon advised that few of the ladies of the parish attend the monthly meetings with the exception of the March and September meetings in preparation for the rummage sales. She would like some suggestions of ways to attract more participation.

**KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS:** Brian Haehl announced that John and Linda Wisker are the family of the month for May. The second annual Eucharistic procession following First Communion was well attended. Fr. Paul was presented with an award at his 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration. The May 19<sup>th</sup> breakfast raised \$700.00 which was divided between The St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Salvation Army Food Pantry.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Janet Brewer will meet with the company selected to review the repair and tuning of the organ.

**NEW BUSINESS:** The Parish Brunch is scheduled for June 23 following the 8:30 am Mass. Suggestions for a caterer beside Just Peachy should be given to Margaret Haehl. She will meet with the caterer and advise the council via group text. The Parish Council will set up and clean up after the Brunch, additional volunteers are welcome.

Margaret presented the 2024-25 budget. The schoolhouse will be used for the RCIA program and Fr. Mike will be the only person to use the copier. Other copies needed will be done at St. Joseph. Ron Browning noted that the Shelbyville Knights of Columbus provided all the chicken for Fr. Paul dinner. A thank you should be sent.

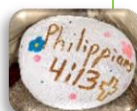
